

A'TUMN Bingo

You will have everyone “falling” for bingo this month with these special bingo cards.

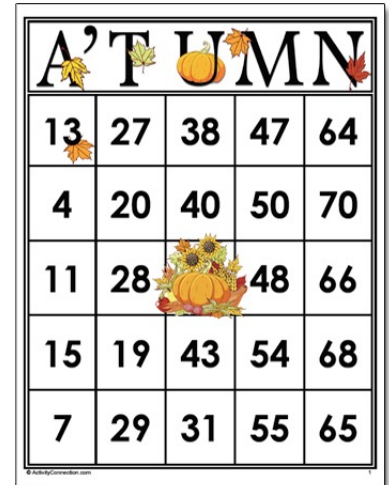
About the Cards

The B-I-N-G-O across the top of each card has been replaced with A'-T-U-M-N, and there is a fall harvest arrangement in the center “free space.” There is also an orange maple leaf behind one of the numbers on each card.

Playing the Game

- Use your standard bingo balls and setup. Select one ball at a time and announce the letter and number, substituting A' for B, T for I, U for N, M for G, and N for O. Make yourself a cheat sheet like the one below for easy reference.

A'	T	U	M	N
B	I	N	G	O



- Play straight-line bingo, coverall, or other special games.

Note: Before the game begins, point out that the N column is not where players would normally find it.

Lucky Leaf

As mentioned above, each card has an orange maple leaf behind one of the numbers. There are several ways it can be used:

- Give players a bonus prize or special prize if their bingo includes the square with the leaf.
- The square can be an extra “free space.”
- Ask players to write their maple leaf number (T22, M59, etc.) on a piece of paper. Draw a winner at the end of the game.

Don't Say “Bingo!”

Ask the players to shout “Autumn!” or “Fall!” when they have a winning card. They lose if they forget and shout “BINGO!”

Prizes

Hand out apples, maple cookies, football key chains, or other items associated with the autumn season.

For Markers

Use your regular bingo markers or print a sheet of maple leaves below for each player. Cut them out along the solid lines, and your markers are ready to go. For heavier markers, print on heavyweight paper (110 lb.) or card stock. Alternatively, glue the sheets to a piece of poster board (spray glue works best). For thicker markers that are easier to pick up, glue the sheets to foam board or thick cardboard and then cut out the markers with a craft knife.
